
On Friday October 12, 2007, several individuals from the wireless telecommunications industry took part in a workshop hosted by Ontario Electronic Stewardship (OES). It was the second of three electronic workshops set-up by OES to support the development of a diversion program plan for Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment under the Ontario *Waste Diversion Act*.

The wireless telecommunications industry recognizes there is a need to promote waste diversion across Ontario, including mobile handset recycling. In fact, the industry has operated several voluntary recycling programs for the last few years. Wireless stewards have developed self-sustaining waste diversion operations and the proceeds of such programs are donated to various charities. Consistent with the "4 Rs" guideline, the amassed phones are refurbished or recycled in an appropriate manner. In fact, through the industry's voluntary programs, approximately 170 thousand mobile phones were collected in the year 2006.

In light of the industry's own voluntary programs to address handset recycling, we would like to start a dialogue with Waste Diversion Ontario (WDO) to develop a program that is tailored to our existing initiatives while meeting the vision and goals of the WDO.

I look forward to meeting with you in the very near future to discuss this matter further, and I will have someone from my office contact your office in the coming weeks to arrange some time for us to meet.
